- To amend title 54, United States Code, to reauthorize the National Parks and Public Land Legacy Restoration Fund, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "America the Beautiful5 Act".

6 SEC. 2. REUAUTHORIZATION OF THE NATIONAL PARKS
7 AND PUBLIC LAND LEGACY RESTORATION
8 FUND.

9 (a) DEPOSITS.—Section 200402(b) of title 54,
10 United States Code, is amended—

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1	(1) in paragraph (1), by striking " $2025$ " and
2	inserting "2033"; and
3	(2) in paragraph (2), by striking
4	"\$1,900,000,000" and inserting "\$2,000,000,000".
5	(b) Use of Funds.—Section 200402(e) of title 54,
6	United States Code, is amended—
7	(1) in paragraph $(1)$ , in the matter preceding
8	subparagraph (A), by striking "in the National
9	Wildlife Refuge System" and inserting "on land ad-
10	ministered by the United States Fish and Wildlife
11	Service''; and
12	(2) by adding at the end the following:
13	"(3) Project prioritization.—The Secretary
14	and the Secretary of Agriculture shall prioritize the
15	use of amounts allocated from the Fund for projects
16	that receive donations under subsection (j) of not
17	less than 15 percent of the total costs of the applica-
18	ble project.".
19	(c) Submission of Annual List of Projects to
20	CONGRESS.—Section 200402(h) of title 54, United States
21	Code, is amended by inserting "and the subsequent fiscal
22	year" before the period at the end.
23	(d) Alternate Allocation.—Section 200402(i) of
24	title 54, United States Code, is amended—

1	(1) in paragraph $(1)$ , by inserting "for the ap-
2	plicable fiscal year and subsequent fiscal year" after
3	"under this section"; and
4	(2) in paragraph (2), by adding at the end the
5	following:
6	"(C) NO FULL-YEAR APPROPRIATIONS EN-
7	ACTED.—If Congress has not enacted full-year
8	appropriations for the Department of the Inte-
9	rior, Environment, and Related Agencies for
10	the applicable fiscal year by the end of the pre-
11	vious fiscal year, amounts made available under
12	subsection (c) shall be allocated by the Presi-
13	dent, if that allocation had previously been ap-
14	proved under paragraph $(1)$ as an allocation for
15	the subsequent fiscal year.".
16	(e) Public Donations.—Section 200402(j) of title
17	54, United States Code, is amended—
18	(1) in the subsection heading, by striking
19	"PUBLIC";
20	(2) in paragraph $(1)$ , in the matter preceding
21	subparagraph (A), by striking "public";
22	(3) by redesignating paragraphs $(2)$ and $(3)$ as
23	paragraphs (3) and (4), respectively;
24	(4) by inserting after paragraph $(1)$ the fol-
25	lowing:

1	"(2) Solicitation of donations.—The Sec-
2	retary and the Secretary of Agriculture shall provide
3	to the public information on the ability of the Sec-
4	retary and the Secretary of Agriculture to accept do-
5	nations under paragraph (1), including through—
6	"(A) public awareness campaigns;
7	"(B) physical or digital donation locations
8	at project sites; and
9	"(C) during the checkout process for the
10	purchase of a physical or digital pass to access
11	a Federal recreational site or an interagency
12	pass, such as the America the Beautiful—the
13	National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands
14	Pass.";
15	(5) by striking paragraph (3) (as so redesig-
16	nated) and inserting the following:
17	"(3) CREDITS TO FUND.—Any cash donations
18	accepted under paragraph (1)—
19	"(A) shall be—
20	"(i) credited to, and form a part of,
21	the Fund; and
22	"(ii) allocated to the covered agency
23	for which the donation was made; and

"(B) may be allocated to specific projects
 included on a list submitted under subsection
 (h)."; and

4 (6) in paragraph (4) (as so redesignated), by
5 striking "paragraph (2)(B)" and inserting "para6 graph (3)(A)(ii)".

7 (f) DISPOSAL OF ASSETS; REPORT TO CONGRESS.—
8 Section 200402 of title 54, United States Code, is amend9 ed by adding at the end the following:

10 "(1) DISPOSAL OF ASSETS.—The Secretary and the 11 Secretary of Agriculture shall provide for the disposal of 12 constructed assets included on a deferred maintenance list 13 submitted under subsection (h) that no longer serve the 14 public interest or advance the mission of the applicable 15 unit to which the asset belongs.

16 "(m) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 1 year 17 after the date of enactment of this subsection, the Secretary and the Secretary of Agriculture shall submit to 18 19 the appropriate committees of Congress a report that— 20 "(1) describes actions taken by the covered 21 agencies without using amounts from the Fund to 22 reduce deferred maintenance in the System, on land 23 administered by the United States Fish and Wildlife 24 Service, on public land administered by the Bureau 25 of Land Management, for the Bureau of Indian

Education schools, and in the National Forest Sys tem; and

"(2) includes a plan from the covered agencies
to increase preventative annual and cyclic maintenance activities by covered agencies to a level that
properly maintains the assets of the covered agencies
and prevents the addition of assets to a deferred
maintenance list under subsection (h).".
